

## Special Specification

### Item 8724

#### Site Specific Health and Safety Plan

##### 8724.1 General Description.

Contractor shall provide management, labor, material, equipment, and related items required to develop, implement, manage, report, and closeout a Site Specific Health and Safety Plan (SSHASP) for this project.

The Contractor is responsible for addressing the safety and health concerns associated with construction activities, including but not limited to the potential hazards, associated with previous land use activities. The Contractor is responsible for reviewing and becoming familiar with the reference documents. These documents include:

1. Phase I Environmental Site Assessment
2. Phase II Environmental Site Assessment

##### 8724.2 Health and Safety of Personnel.

Contractor shall be responsible for ensuring that work activities performed under this Contract by Contractor's, its subcontractors' or suppliers' personnel at the project site complies with the applicable standards and requirements of OSHA's Title 29 CFR Part 1910 and 1926, as well as the applicable federal, state, and local laws, regulations, and guidances.

##### 8724.3 Preparation of a Site Specific Health and Safety Plan (SSHASP).

Contractor shall prepare and submit electronically to the Engineer a written Site-Specific Health and Safety Plan (SSHASP) within 30 days after the Contract award date. The Contractor is subject to the performance requirements and specifications of the established SSHASP, as this Plan is included by reference as part of the Contract. No work shall begin prior to Contractor providing a copy of the SSHASP to the Engineer. The SSHASP shall address construction activities, with consideration to the potential hazards as identified in Section One "General Description" of this document. A hard copy of the SSHASP shall be maintained at the project site and made available for review at all times.

The preparation of the SSHASP should be developed as a supplement to the contractor's normal health and safety plan. Contractor shall examine the aspects of the scope of work when preparing the SSHASP as it relates to normal construction activities and considerations as related to the potential hazards as identified in Section One "General Description"; the plan shall be consistent with applicable health and safety regulations and good work practices with the objective of preventing exposure, accidents, or injuries.

At the preconstruction meeting as scheduled by the Engineer, the Contractor shall review the work activities and describe how the activities will be performed consistent with the SSHASP. Contractor shall keep the Engineer or its representative apprised of the activities throughout the duration of the project. If deemed necessary by the Engineer, the Contractor shall conduct a stand-alone meeting to brief the Engineer and the Engineer's representatives, and address any concerns, on the final SSHASP that will be implemented by the Contractor.

#### 8724.4 Supervision and Applicable Training.

The Contractor shall have at all times, regardless of how much of the work may be sublet, a competent, reliable superintendent on the job site to act for the Contractor. This superintendent shall be HAZWOPER certified in performing the type of work required under the contract and shall have had experience supervising similar work on at least five previous jobs of equal or greater scope. At the preconstruction meeting, Contractor shall submit the name of the superintendent(s) and their credentials to the Engineer for review and concurrence.

Contractor shall be responsible for ensuring that their onsite personnel, subcontractors, and suppliers are informed of foreseeable hazards and protective measures associated with the work to be performed at the project site and that workers have received applicable OSHA training required specifically for each work activity that they will be performing.

#### 8724.5 Access Control.

Contractor shall prohibit unauthorized persons from entering the project area during the performance of this Contract. Contractor shall be responsible for ensuring that applicable OSHA requirements and standards are met before any person is allowed to enter the project area.

#### 8724.6 Payment.

Payment for the Site Specific Health and Safety Plan shall be made at the lump sum amount bid. Compensation shall include management, labor, material, equipment, and related items required to develop, implement, manage, report, and closeout the work as described above.
