

## Special Specification

### Item 8733

#### Waste Management and Disposal Plan

##### 8733.1 General Description

Contractor shall provide management, labor, material, equipment, and related items required to develop, implement, manage, report, and closeout a Waste Management and Disposal Plan for this project.

Areas of Concern are identified in the plans and the Environmental Site Assessments. Copies of existing Environmental Site Assessments shall be made available to the Contractor. The Contractor is responsible for reviewing and becoming familiar with the reference documents. These documents include:

1. Phase I Environmental Site Assessment
2. Phase II Environmental Site Assessment

##### 8733.2 General Practices

Contaminants potentially exist at the areas of concern. Material and liquids removed from this area, or as directed by the Engineer, shall require special management practices. Material and liquids shall be staged and suitably stored, tested, properly transported and disposed of legally.

##### 8733.3 Environmental Compliance

The contractor shall comply with federal, state, and local regulations. The Contractor shall classify the potentially regulated waste that is generated or encountered during the course of this project. Waste profiling/characterization and classification shall conform to the requirements described in 30 TAC §§ 335.501 – 335.515, 335.521 (Subchapter R).

##### 8733.4 Waste Management and Disposal Plan (WMDP)

The contractor shall prepare and submit an electronic copy of the WMDP to the Engineer within 30 days of the contract award date.

The WMDP shall include, but not be limited to the following:

1. Purpose and Scope of the WMDP – document the reason the WMDP is being prepared and what potential types of waste are expected.
2. General Waste Practices – provide a description of the practices that will be utilized and how they benefit the integrity of the site.
3. Waste Handlers – provide list companies and individuals that will be responsible for performing and overseeing the work. Include name, location , and contact information of facility receiving waste.

4. Location of Storage/Staging Areas – identify location of areas that will be used to stage and/or temporarily store the potential waste.
5. Management of Storage/Staging Areas – provide procedures for managing the storage area to include, but not be limited to, maintaining a segregated area within the storage area and a plan for protecting the storage area from exterior influences.
6. Waste Sampling Procedures – provide detailed procedures for collecting samples, laboratory analytical testing procedures, and preparation of classification profiles.
7. Waste Tracking – provide procedures to track and measure the potential waste and verified waste, including its type.

#### 8733.5 Payment

Payment will be made for the WMDP on a lump sum basis.

The contractor shall furnish labor, materials, equipment, and related items required for the preparation of the WMDP.
